When a first responder dies, one of the first decisions a leader must make is how it will be classified and treated by the agency. Did the death occur in the line of duty or are 'active duty' honors appropriate? An incorrect classification, either way, can have far-reaching and long-term consequences for the family, agency, and community.

This class examines the relationship between HONOR and BENEFITS:

- How to distinguish between active-duty and line-of-duty death
- What is the role that honor plays in establishing benefits criteria
- How are line-of-duty death benefits criteria established and what role honor plays
- What are the state line-of-duty death benefits
- How are retirement benefits impacted by line-of-duty death
- What agencies and individuals within those agencies are covered
- What special provisions are made for working out, EMS personnel, heart attacks, strokes, vascular ruptures, COVID-19 deaths, and COVID-19 survivors
- What are death, disability, and education benefits
- Who are eligible beneficiaries and how is the recipient(s) determined
- Which factors can cause benefits to be denied
- What about suicide
