Building on the fundamentals of your agency's basic use of force program, this one-day course prepares members to manage force-related incidents effectively. Learn supervisory oversight, incident scene management, and the executive responsibility of building community trust before, during, and after an event.

This one-day program discusses the ongoing evolution of force-related events and how organizational leadership can utilize lessons learned from every situation to enhance our team and practices. The program focuses on the meaningful review process, officer development interviews, incorporation of lessons learned into a 360-degree organizational improvement model and more.
